Sweet Dreams

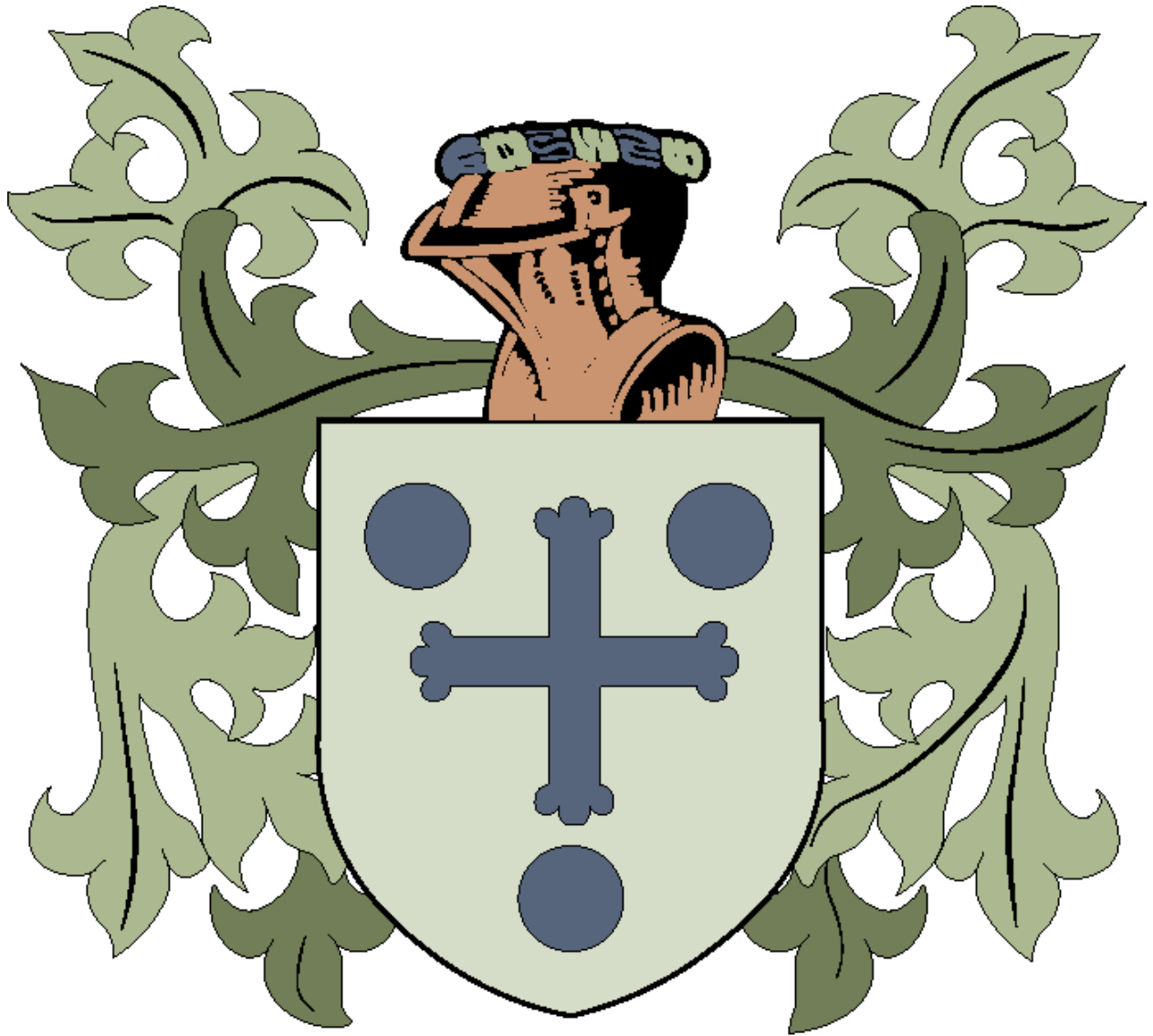
A bedtime story is a traditional form of storytelling, where a story is told to a child at bedtime to prepare the child for sleep
